Bank Guarantee Form of irrevocable guarantee by a commercial bank which is carrying out banking business in the Republic or in a Member State of the European Union, or by a cooperative institution, for the purpose of covering players who have participated in a bet and have won or in the form of tax and/or contribution that corresponds to the bets to be accepted.

1. We undertake to pay the above amount without reference to our client and regardless of any objection on his part, immediately upon receiving your written request, wherein you must indicate that our client has not fulfilled their obligations and that you are requesting payment in accordance with the present guarantee.
2. This guarantee shall be effective until the date of expiry indicated above including that date and, until that date, (or, if that date is a bank holiday, up to and including the immediately preceding, day which is not a bank holiday) we should have received any claim that you may have. After the expiration of the above-mentioned expiry date, and provided that we have not received any written claim that you may have until that date, the Letter of Guarantee will be deemed to be void, whether or not it has been returned back to us.
3. The Letter of Guarantee shall be governed by and construed under and in accordance with the laws of the Republic of Cyprus and shall fall within the jurisdiction of the Cyprus Courts.
This guarantee is irrevocable and shall be in force for a period of six months after the expiration of the licence of the Class A licensed bookmaker who is our client.
